- Need a plan and action items

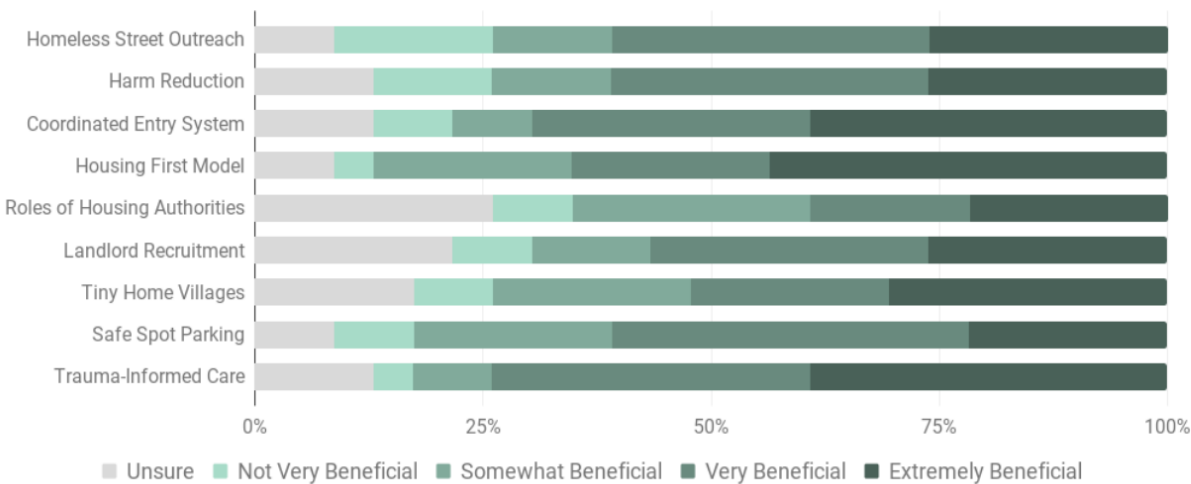


highlights

The majority of responses ranked their interest in a workgroup as Neutral (3 out of 5) and Extremely Interested (5 out of 5), both with 30.4%

- Identify Issue/Topic for Workgroups: some options include youth-focused, real-time resources, street outreach, funding/grant writing, evaluation, landlord recruitment
